I am writing to you with profound gratitude for the incredible support and assistance you've provided to our organization over the years. Whether through financial contributions, volunteering your time, sharing your ideas, offering guidance to students, donating clothes, toys, grains, infrastructure support, or nutritious food for street children, your help has been invaluable in fulfilling our mission.

It brings me immense satisfaction to share that, to date, our organization has positively impacted the lives of over 35,000 beneficiaries. The results of our collective efforts are both inspiring and

transformative. This year alone, we dedicated Rs 3.5 crore to various initiatives, reaching approximately 6,500 individuals—from street school students to university graduates and elderly women—through our relentless commitment to education and opportunity.

Our Asha Deep program, 'Street to School' initiative, has made significant progress. With 38 centers across Vadodara, we are now educating over 1,000 children. We've implemented a comprehensive evaluation system to track each child's development holistically, supported by our dedicated team of coordinators and teachers. Regular workshops for our educators and engaging extracurricular activities for the children have yielded remarkable results, showcasing their creativity and growth.

The Asha Deep Mentor Sponsor (ADMS) Program, which supports bright primary students from Asha Deep centers, continues to thrive. This program provides these children with top-notch educational resources, including smart TVs and computer labs, and emphasizes extracurricular involvement. In recent years, the rakhi-making skills of these students have been sent to our nation's defense forces, receiving heartfelt appreciation.

Our flagship Open Scholarship Program is set to award approximately Rs 2.75 crores in scholarships to around 3,500 students this year (2024-25). Our internship initiative, supported by 60 interns from Navrachna University, has been instrumental in reaching over 3,000 families, facilitating scholarship allocation, and fostering empathy, compassion, and gratitude among the interns—values that will guide them in their future endeavors.

This year, the Kayakalp Program has been revamped while preserving its core principles. We have now extended greater financial assistance and personal mentorship to over 200 exceptionally talented students—our "Shining Stars"—to support their journey through higher education with comprehensive guidance. We invested over Rs 75 lakhs in these students this year. I am pleased to share that one of our students, the son of an auto-rickshaw driver, has secured admission to IIT Goa for Computer Science, while another student, whose father is a contract laborer, has been admitted to NIT Surat for Electronics & Communication.

The Marg Darshan (Vocational Training Program) has been well-received, with participants quickly acquiring skills that enable them to earn Rs 10-12k per month. The success of this program has attracted corporate interest, and we are working on partnerships to provide training, stipends, and ITI certificates. We plan to expand the program to include various vocations, such as fitter, plumbing, turning, and solar technology, offering flexible entry requirements and focusing on skill development and employability. This program is open to anyone over 18 who has completed at least the 8th grade.

The Naya Savera (Adult Education Program), designed for the mothers and elder sisters of Asha Deep children, is also thriving. To encourage participation, we now offer a monthly credit of Rs 500 to their accounts.

We are excited to introduce UPVAN, a new initiative focused on urban forest development using the Miyawaki technique, in collaboration with VMC and various corporates. We have already developed three plots and are planning three more, with an expected investment of Rs 25-30 lakhs. This technique offers numerous benefits, including rapid growth, increased density, enhanced carbon absorption, high biodiversity, and sustainability.

Our Annual Cultural Evening at the Sayajinagar Gruh Auditorium and the Annual Sports Day at Billabong International High School received enthusiastic acclaim, reflecting our community's support and engagement.

In closing, I offer my heartfelt gratitude to all our donors, supporters, corporate partners, and members of the MI-MFT family. Your steadfast support has been the foundation of our success. Together, we will keep making a significant difference in the lives of those we serve.




GUIDING PHILOSOPHY

Love All Serve All, Live & Let Live

For 24 years, the **Mahavir Foundation Trust (MFT)** has dedicated itself to uplifting underprivileged communities, with a special focus on supporting children's education. In the past year, MFT supported approximately 6500 students, investing around Rs 3.5 crores through various educational initiatives, ranging from street schools to university education.

Mahavir International, Vadodara Kendra comprising some of Vadodara's most respected citizens, this group collaborates closely with MFT, contributing both time and money to effectively implement the foundation's initiatives. The organization firmly believes that education is key to uplifting families and bridging societal disparities, ultimately contributing to a better India.





















ADOPTED SCHOOLS INITIATIVE

- Inception and Mission: Initiated in 2001, this initiative aims to support, motivate, and guide students from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds, focusing on high school and higher secondary levels.
- Selection Process: Mahavir International members actively participate in selecting beneficiaries.
- Support Provided: 299 students in 5 schools received cash awards and scholarships. Bright students are recognized with awards, while others are given scholarships during school events to avoid dropping out.
- Female Students: Many female students assist their working mothers to take care of household expenses

















OPEN SCHOLARSHIP INITIATIVE

- Launch and Scope: Started in 2005, this flagship initiative of MFT offers the most extensive outreach, providing scholarships from 8th grade through to the first degree, including professional courses.
- Key Features: Continuous support, personal assessments through house visits by members, interns, and volunteers, and annual reassessments.
- Scholarship Distribution: Typically conducted in well-organized events. Over 3,100 students have been supported with scholarships totaling Rs. 1.96 crores. Higher financial assistance to bright students.

















ASHA DEEP (Street To School Initiative)

- Objective: Educating marginalized children through centers located in unconventional areas.
- Operations: Classes run 2-3 hours daily, six days a week, offering formal education and holistic development. Uniforms, shoes, school bags, and nutritious food are provided.
- Progression: Some students transition to ADMS to receive special coaching.
- **Community Involvement:** With centers in public locations, community engagement is significant. The initiative currently serves 960 children across 38 centers.

















ASHA DEEP MENTOR-SPONSOR INITIATIVE

- Focus: Mentoring 72 bright and needy students from 1st to 8th standard, primarily from Asha Deep Centers and other underprivileged segments.
- Student-Teacher Ratio: 10:1, allowing for personalized attention.
- Holistic Development: Equal emphasis on extracurricular activities and overall growth.
- Best resources: This program provides these children with top-notch educational resources, including smart TVs, computer labs, etc.

















KAYAKALP INITIATIVE

Objective: To provide the best facilities and resources for the development of bright and needy students of standards 9th to 12th (Science Stream). Both schooling and Kayakalp (after-school holistic coaching) at Baroda High School, Danteshwar. 112 students benefitted from this program.

















ANNUAL CULTURAL EVENING

- Event Overview: Held annually in a large auditorium, this event features competitive dancing and musical entertainment, serving as a platform for reconnecting with well-wishers, donors, volunteers, and others.
- It provides a big platform to our underprivileged beneficiaries to showcase their talents.
- Participation: Students from Adopted Schools, Asha Deep, ADMS, its teachers, and Kayakalp participate. The last event, held on 16th
 December 2023 at Sir Sayaji Rao Nagar Gruh with capacity audience and appreciated by one and all.

















ANNUAL SPORTS DAY

- Event Highlights: Held annually at Billabong High International School.
- This event involves enthusiastic participation from all Asha Deep and ADMS students, showcasing sportsmanship and zeal.
- Awards: Winners and runners-up receive recognition and awards, and selected Asha Deep teachers are honored
- The most recent event was on 18th February 2024

















MARGDARSHAN (Vocational Training Program)

- **Objectives:** To provide comprehensive support, including career guidance, counseling, vocational training, job opportunities, and entrepreneurship assistance, to economically disadvantaged students and those who dropped out after the 9th grade.
- Outcome: Training participants can earn Rs 10,000 to 12,000 per month after just three months. The program has successfully completed five batches of wiremen/electricians.
- Corporate Collaborations: Efforts are ongoing to partner with more corporates (Transpek, HILTI, Silox, Kutch Chemicals etc.) and skill development institutions.








SAMVEDANA, HEALTH & HYGIENE

- Objectives: to collect clothes, toys, and household items from affluent or caring individuals, and distribute them to needy recipients.
- To provide health and hygiene education to young girls and women, with regular distribution of sanitary pads.
- Outcome: Over 18000 beneficiaries received items like clothes, household items, stationery items etc. 500 girls and women, including those from Asha Deep Centers and nearby areas, have benefited from the health and hygiene initiative.











NAYA SAVERA (Adult Education for Women)

- Objective: Educating the mothers and elder sisters of Asha Deep's children and women near Asha Deep centers. Ensures they attain basic reading and writing skills in the local language and enhances their financial literacy, including the ability to operate bank accounts independently.
- Current Status: Four operational centers are serving 52 women. To encourage participation, we now offer a monthly credit of Rs 500 to their accounts.
